Also discussed were current projects and proposed projects and outlining a timeline for those projects to get a better idea of how the growth for the city can progress.

The Commission would like to review Appendix A in the New Melle Ordinances and would welcome guidance on how to revise the appendix to reflect the current land use/future land use to best represent the city and Comprehensive Plan.
